## Micro Blood Dot Egg by Piscator Flies

Materials (substitute as necessary)

**Hook:** Mustad C67s or Egg Hook **Bead:** Gold Brass Bead (optional)

Thread: Fl. Orange

**Bloodspot**: Pink McFly Foam Yarn

Red McFly Foam Yarn

Head cement for final thread wraps

## Comments

This simple egg fly pattern is great for steelhead and trout alike. This micro-egg fly pattern can be tied in a range of sizes, but smaller dense eggs should be around 1/4 in diameter and tied on size 16 or 18 hooks. the fly pattern is simple to tie, but you may need to practice trimming the yarn so that the bottom and top are even. Be sure that you have sharp scissors and that you grasp and pull the yarn when you snip it.

You can use Egg yarn or the McFly Foam yarn. It's my experience that the McFly foam material creates a better egg fly pattern with it being able to hold a better shape when wet.

**Hook:** Mustad C67s or Egg Hook, #08 – 18 Tiemco 2457

**Bead:** Gold Brass Bead (optional)

Thread: Fl. Orange, or color to suit

**Body:** Pink McFly Foam Yarn

**Bloodspot**: Red McFly Foam Yarn

Head cement for final thread wraps

The McFlyFoam Egg (also known as "Glo Bug") is a simple and deadly egg pattern. McFlyFoam is available in dozens of colors, and they can be mixed, matched and blended together. The McFlyFoam Egg, even simple in nature, is not so simple to tie. There are a few tricks to tying them and these tricks will help you make perfect little round eggs every time! Give them a try. Once you master the technique, you can really crank them out!!
